Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!

Peace and grace to you, dear brothers and sisters, laborers in the field of God, relatives and friends! We cordially greet you in the love of our risen Savior Jesus Christ!

Finally, spring has come to Moldova. The locals say that this a "classic" spring is; meaning, it's what it used to be before the onset of the so-called "global warming." After the winter cold and snowfall, warming began gradually. And now Moldova is really warm. Most fruit trees have bloomed and there are flowers growing everywhere. The smell of lilacs fills the air with fragrance. Great time!

> On April 4, members of the Council of the Union of Baptist Churches of Moldova were gathered at Bethel Church in Chisinau. This Council consists of those overseeing churches in one of the nine regions of the country, and members of their regional councils. The bishop of **Baptist Union of** Moldova, N.G. Vozian, asked me to share from the

Word of God with those assembled. On the one hand, it is a privilege to speak to such a group of responsible ministers. On the other hand, this is a challenge and responsibility—after all, they are all mentors of other ministers in their regions. I was glad to meet all these brothers again—I spoke to them last in March 2017, and shared with them a word of encouragement.





From the 11th to the 15th of April, Nina and I traveled to Latvia. On the day of arrival to Riga, on the **11th of April**, in the evening, we visited the "Bratskiy Dom" (Brotherhood House) rehabilitation center in the village, Saureshi, not far from the city of Salaspils. The director of the center is brother Yury Larionov. He also performs pastoral ministry in the church, which holds its meetings in the territory of the rehabilitation center. Participants of which have the opportunity to



regularly attend the services of this church. That evening, the 11th of April, the church was brought together, and I had the opportunity to share from the Word of God with the church members and guests. Nina and I were amazed at the amount of work that is being done in the rehabilitation center. And this despite the fact that this center does not have stable financial support. Please pray for this ministry and its funding.



On April 12 and 13, at the request of the Director of the Latvian Bible Center, Viktor Ivanovich Petrenko, and other church ministers, I conducted a seminar in this educational institution on the topic "*The realities of life in a multicultural society: How we can live together and not hurt each other*?"

The building of the Bible Center has an amazing history. Currently it is a beautiful modern building. However, only a few years ago it was half-ruined and was a sad sight. At one time in the past, this building was occupied by a Bible school founded by the famous evangelist Fetler. Later it came to complete desolation. Under the leadership of V.I. Petrenko this building was restored. It was a lot of work and courage to do this. As a result, continuity in ministry has been maintained. As in the times of Fetler, today the training of Gospel ministers is being carried out in this building.





On Sunday, **April 14th**, we visited the church in city of Jekabpils, which is located 120 km from Riga. On this day in the churches of Latvia remembered the triumphal entry of Jesus Christ into Jerusalem. We were pleased to celebrate this holiday with the members of this church. I took part in the service by preaching the Word of God.





A visit to Latvia always awakens special feelings in us. A lot of memories come to mind about what we experienced in our youth, when we lived in this country. We are very grateful to the Lord for giving us the opportunity to visit this region again which is close to our hearts.



On Sunday, **April 21**, we visited a church in the village of Baltsaty, which is located near Chisinau. Considering that in Moldova, as in Ukraine and Russia, the Easter holiday was celebrated this year one week later than in America and Western Europe, the holiday of the triumphal entry of Jesus Christ into Jerusalem was celebrated in Moldova, on April 21st. Thus, this year we had the opportunity to celebrate this holiday twice—once in Latvia, another time in Moldova (3).





The ministry in the church we attended was festive. The choir sang very nicely. Although the congregation is small - about 60 members, its singing ministry is at a high level. Not only did young people and children participate in the program of the service, but also people in their older years. One of them, a woman older than 80 years, recited by heart a long poem about the holiday. She did it very beautifully. When I asked the local brothers who this

sister was, they explained to me that she was a former Russian language teacher in Soviet times. At that time, she was an opponent of believers and greatly oppressed those students who were from Christian families. However, as time passed, the Lord touched her heart. She repented, was baptized and is now in church. Praise God for His mercy to this soul!

I was given the opportunity in this service to deliver a sermon.
